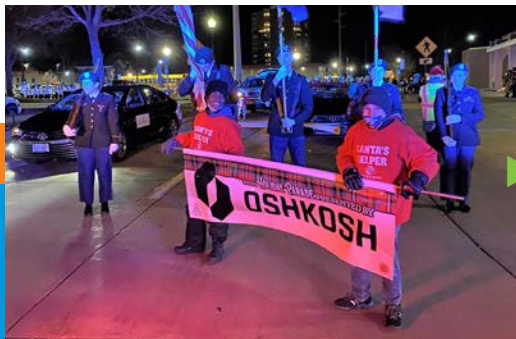

The Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh is pleased to announce the 2022 Youth of the Year winner – Goodness. Each year a local Youth of the Year committee interviews teenage applicants at the Club. They are judged on their service to their Club, community, and family, academic success, strong moral character, life goals, and poise and public speaking ability. The teen who scores highest in these areas is chosen as the Youth of the Year winner for the organization.

Goodness is a senior at Oshkosh North High School and is Co-President of our Keystone Leadership Club. She is also an active member in a number of clubs at school and aspires to be a neurosurgeon in the future.

In November 2021, Goodness competed against three other local Club members for the title and

ultimately won. As the Oshkosh Club's 2022 Youth of the Year, Goodness was awarded a \$10,000 scholarship from the Boys & Girls Club's Charles F. Hyde, Jr. Youth of the Year Scholarship Endowment!

Goodness will now compete in the Wisconsin State Youth of the Year in March alongside Youth of the Year winners from all over Wisconsin.

# Our Tween Programs are Growing

## ► Quest Program at the Club

Our tween-specific Quest program is currently in its first year here at the club. This past summer was the first year that we offered a specific program directed towards our tweens, those in their pre-teen years from ages 10-12 years old, in our summer program. Our school-year Quest program includes those ages 9-12. Our goal for this program is for members to feel that they have their own space to be themselves and prepare them for middle school and high school. The older children in the group are given opportunities to learn more responsibility before moving up to the Teen program.

With this program, we have been able to offer this age group many different and new opportunities. We incorporate activities to help with navigating the tween years, middle school, and learning how to acknowledge what they're feeling in order to improve mental wellness. We began offering Tween Nights on Tuesdays from 6-7 p.m. Each week kids can participate in themed activities outside of our regular programming like game shows, pizza or baking cook-offs, club jeopardy, staff vs. kids volleyball games, or holiday themed crafts. Tween Nights have provided a place for members that don't typically attend our regular programming to get to know other kids. We're excited to say that many of these members have now begun coming to the Club regularly.

We have also been able to expand Torch Club. Torch Club is a student-led Boys & Girls Club of America program, for kids in middle school, that focuses on community service and leadership skills. The Club works to show kids that their voices matter and that they can truly make a difference. We are excited to have started this program and continue to welcome new members!

## ► South Park Middle School Program

Our first year at South Park Middle School is underway and we couldn't be more excited to be there! Currently, this program runs in sessions. There are two eight-week sessions with the opportunity to expand. The programs run from 3:30 - 5:30 p.m. Monday - Thursday and includes academic tutoring and a snack followed by a different activity or program for the day. We run activities relating to STEM, social & emotional learning, arts and crafts, healthy habits and more. When the program is not in session Club staff continue to offer an academic hour and snack from 3:30 - 4:30 p.m. We continue to work with the wonderful staff at South Park to meet the needs of their kids & families and offer the best programming possible. We are looking forward to seeing the South Park Middle School program grow!

# Become a Big Futures Mentor



We're excited to have launched the Big Futures Mentoring Program and introduce you to Jay Gibson, our Big Futures Mentoring Coordinator. Jay has over 30 years of experience in youth mentoring in multiple capacities.

This collaborative effort between the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh and Big Brothers Big Sisters of East Central Wisconsin combines the expertise of both organizations, the Club's Great Futures Mentoring Program with Big Brothers Big Sisters' evidence-based mentoring program and case management expertise, to continue to match

adult mentors with youth in 6th through 8th grade at the Boys & Girls Club.

The program focuses on helping youth grow academically and develop decision-making and life skills. Youth will meet mentors at the Club or at school, where they will get homework help, read together, learn to cook together, and get access to all Club spaces and programs such as basic needs, mental health support, art room and active time in the gym.
