Please note that if the Oshkosh Area School District cancels after school activities due to weather, Club-provided transportation will not run that night either.

Expectations

Your child is expected to participate fully in each program and behave according to our Club rules that can be found in our Parent Handbook. If you do not have a handbook, please request one from our Radford Center front desk. Children who choose not to follow these expectations will not be able to participate in our program.

School Attendance

If for any reason your child does not attend school, they will not be allowed to attend the Boys & Girls Club that day.

PBIS Guidelines

The Club follows PBIS guidelines and expectations. Safety, Respect, Responsibility and Mindfulness are of the utmost importance. The Club reserves the right to refuse, suspend, or terminate membership of any youth if their behavior or attitude is disrespectful to staff, volunteers, or other members, or if their behavior does not allow them to function with others appropriately in our programs. Club membership is a privilege, not a right. For a complete list of policies and expectations, please request a Parent Handbook.

Bully Free Zone

The Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh is a bully free zone and strives to provide a safe, secure and respectful environment for all members in our facilities, on Boys & Girls Club grounds, and in our vehicles as well at Boys & Girls Club sponsored activities. Bullying has a harmful social, physical and psychological impact on bullies, victims and bystanders. The Boys & Girls Club consistently and vigorously addresses bullying.

Zones of Regulation

Zones of regulation provides strategies to teach members to become more aware of and independent in controlling their sensory needs and improving their ability to problem solve conflicts. The zones can be compared to a stoplight or traffic sign. When given a green light (in the green zone), one is "good to go." A yellow light or caution sign means slow down or take warning, which applies to the Yellow Zone. A red light or stop sign means stop; when a person is in the Red Zone, they need to stop and refocus. This program helps our members to have control over their actions and movements.

Open-door Policy

The Boys & Girls Club Radford Center and The CLUB Teen Center both have an open door policy. It is a parent's responsibility to make sure that their child understands the departure procedure from the Club. Children choosing to leave the Club may not return until the following day. This policy excludes 5-6 year olds who may not leave the Club on non-school days unless they have been signed out by an authorized adult.





Club Fees

Annual Membership Fee

Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh membership is annual and all memberships are renewed annually on September 1. Club membership fees are \$25 for the first child, \$15 for the second child and \$10 for any additional children, not to exceed \$50 per family. We charge nominal Club fees and offer scholarships for certain programs to those families who are not able to pay.

Non-School Day Fees

The Club has additional daily fees for non-school days for 5-12 year olds. Teens are free after 11:30 a.m. Teens who want to attend the Club earlier than 11:30 a.m. must be in the Jr. Staff program. Please see the CLUB Teen Center 411 for more info.

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Character and Leadership

Our goal in our Character and Leadership programming is to build the skills needed today to be effective leaders tomorrow. We empower our young people to support and influence their Club and community, sustain meaningful relationships with others, develop a positive self-image, participate in the democratic process and respect their own and others' cultural identities.

Keystone Club

Keystone is the Boys & Girls Club Movement's ultimate teen program. This unique leadership development experience provides opportunities for high school aged teens. Youth participate, both in and out of the Club, in activities in three focus areas: academic success, career preparation and community service. With the guidance of an adult advisor, Keystone Clubs aim to have a positive impact on members, the Club and community.

Mentoring

Club members in need of a role model are matched with an adult mentor committed to meeting with them for four hours a month for at least two years. Mentors and mentees meet at the Club and participate in fun activities together and develop a plan for their mentee's future following high school graduation.

STEP UP

STEP UP is an anti-bullying program aimed at decreasing gang-involvement and negative interactions between police and youth. Local law enforcement officers from the Oshkosh Police Department work weekly with youth, promoting academic success through tutoring, building healthy relationships and positive interactions with all and having fun!

Torch Club

Torch Club is a chartered, small-group leadership and service club for middle school aged boys and girls. Torch Club is a powerful vehicle through which Club staff can help meet the special character development needs of younger adolescents at a critical stage in their life. Torch Club members learn to elect officers and work together to implement activities in four areas: service to Club and community, education, health and fitness, and social recreation.

Youth of the Month

Provides members ages 6-18 the opportunity to showcase their leadership ability and be recognized among their peers. Each month, staff choose a member from each program area to be the member of the month. These members are recognized in April with a special dinner and award at our annual Youth of the Year Dinner event.

Academic Success

What do you want to be when you grow up? No matter how a child answers that question, we want to help them build a strong foundation to realize their goals. Our educational programs allow young people to explore their options and reach their full potential. We are growing tomorrow's leaders today.

3-D Printing

3-D Printing gives members the opportunity to design and create three-dimensional objects. Kids will work with staff members, as well as community partners, to design and create some amazing projects including cell phone cases, holders, fidget spinners and more!

Career Launch

Career Launch has a brand new curriculum where teens can explore a broad range of career areas, match their interests to career clusters and identify the skills and education needed for their particular career path. Career Launch is designed to support youth in preparing for their first job, internships, summer employment and so much more! This program may take place one-on-one or in smaller groups.

LEGO League/Robotics

LEGO League/Robotics immerses 4-8th grade members in real-world science and technology challenges.

Teams build LEGO-based robots and develop research

projects. Through their participation, children develop valuable life skills and discover exciting career possibilities while learning that they can make a positive contribution to society.

Literacy Program

The Boys & Girls Club works with the Oshkosh Public Library to provide a reading program at the Club. Members can sign up at the Club and track their reading to achieve different incentives.

Making Minutes Count/Power Hour

Making Minutes Count/Power Hour offers a structured time and place for Club staff, academic tutors and volunteers to help members understand and complete their homework assignments and turn them in on time. Members are better prepared for classes and proud of their hard work and accomplishments. This program also provides high yield activities that help members become self-directed, resourceful and independent learners.

Money Matters

Money Matters is a program that is designed to help teens with proper money management and provide them the skills to enter the working world. Some of the things teens learn include opening a savings account, credit and debit card responsibility, budgeting, etc.



Professional Workshop

High school aged teens can participate in a four week Professional Workshop that teaches teens how to introduce themselves, how to dress to impress, what a personal brand is and how to use their own brands to their benefit. After attending the first three weeks, the teens pick out a professional outfit and attend the Business Expo to practice the skills they learned throughout the program. Skills to Pay the Bills

Skills to Pay the Bills teaches high school students the soft skills they will need to get a job including positive attitude and communication, teamwork, networking, problem solving, critical thinking, professionalism and great customer service.

STRIDE Academy

STRIDE Academy is a web based learning program that incorporates math, reading and science into a fun gaming environment. The program is available at the Club through statewide Wisconsin After 3 funding. The goal of the program is to improve STEM (science, technology, engineering and math) amongst Club members in 1st-8th grades.

STEM

The Club provides opportunities in science, technology, engineering and mathematics (STEM) with innovative and creative programs. Each week there are a variety of activities that center around these topics that members are able to explore and learn more about.

Teens 2 Work

Teens in high school can sign up to be part of our Teens 2 Work program. Broken down into 4 levels, the Teens 2 Work program is designed to help teens develop crucial job and life skills and eventually work their way into community employment in an area they might be interested in pursuing after high school.

Healthy Lifestyles

Engaging young people in positive behaviors that nurture their own well-being, our health and life skills programming teaches the importance of setting personal goals and developing the competencies necessary to live successfully as self-sufficient adults.

Boys II Men

Boys II Men is a program that engages teen boys in discussions and activities that reinforce character, leadership and positive behavior. Interactive activities are used to aid in the growth and development of young men. Activities include learning to cook, doing laundry, learning to tie a tie and participating in community service projects. Discussion topics cover issues like respectful treatment of others, the importance of academics, healthy hobbies and coping skills.

Fitness Challenges

Join the Club's Health and Wellness Coordinator in weekly fitness challenges. Challenges include eating well, exercise, mindfulness, and overall healthy tasks such as getting enough sleep, drinking water, trying a new food or meditation.

Healthy Habits

Healthy Habits emphasizes good nutrition, regular physical activity and improving overall well-being. As part of the program, kids have the opportunity to prepare tasty and healthy snacks using typical ingredients found at home.

Smart Girls

SMART Girls is a small-group health, fitness, prevention/education and self-esteem enhancement program designed to meet the development needs of girls in three age groups, spanning ages 8—18. Through dynamic sessions, participatory activities, field trips and mentoring opportunities with adult women, Club girls explore their own social attitudes and values as they build skills for eating right, staying physically fit, getting good health care and developing positive relationships with peers and adults.

Teen Cuisine

Teen Cuisine is a fun program where teens prepare snack items for themselves and their peers. This teaches them how to prepare simple dishes as well as responsible usage of kitchen equipment. The food will vary every week so they will learn a variety of snack recipes.

Triple Play

Triple Play improves Club member's knowledge of healthy habits, increases the number of hours per day they participate in physical activities and strengthens their ability to interact positively with others and engage in positive relationships.

The Arts

Our arts programming enables young people to develop their creativity and cultural awareness through knowledge and appreciation of visual and tactile arts and crafts, performing arts, and creative writing. Club members participate in a wide variety of activities from story-telling, writing, musical performances, drawing, and painting. Special activities are planned and conducted quarterly to generate enthusiasm for the arts and cultural diversity.

Arts & Crafts

Club members create beautiful creations in the art room by expressing themselves through a variety of projects. Members can join in a variety of activities such as painting, jewelry making, newspaper club, clay sculpting, and much more on a daily basis.

Digital Arts

The Digital Arts Suite teaches members ages 6 to 18 how to create computer-generated art. In each of six programs (Animation Tech, Design Tech, Game Tech, Photo Tech, Music Tech and Movie Tech), members advance through three levels of animated lessons online and participate in instructor-led group activities.

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Fine Arts

This year-round program encourages artistic expression among Club members ages 6-18 through nine different categories of visual arts. These categories include monochromatic and multi-colored drawing, oil painting and watercolor, printmaking, collage, mixed media, pastel and group projects while providing opportunities for members to create artwork for display.

Music/Lyricism

Music lessons offered at the CLUB are guitar, piano, bass, drums, and voice. Based on interest, other instruments can be offered as well. Lyricism is a program designed to cultivate and amplify the powerful, formidable voices of CLUB teens. This program gives teens an opportunity to tell their poetic stories, build community and express their artistic visions through the music of hip-hop culture and the culture of the cipher.

Photography

Photography is designed to help members go beyond snapshots and develop skills to take photographs that can really impact the viewer.

Sports, Fitness & Recreation

Engagement. Teamwork. Dedication. Our young people learn these valuable lessons when they are pushed to excel and given the skills to accomplish their goals. Our sports, fitness and recreation programs focus on meeting each youth where they are at and helping them set goals to reach the next level.

Soccer


Different ages of soccer opportunities are available for youth to practice their skills and play in scrimmage games against each other.

Junior Staff

This is a volunteer program for any teen (13 & up) who would like to work within the Club, gaining useful employment skills and knowledge. Teens must complete training in order to be considered for a position in the Club, as well as daily evaluations and progress reports each time they work. Teens will be placed under the supervision of a staff member in an area of the Club based on their skills, interests and future career goals. Teens must be willing to help in any area needing assistance. Jobs may include helping staff run programs and activities, tutoring elementary members, serving dinner and snack and doing general cleaning tasks.

Middle School Nights

All members in Middle School or higher can attend the Club on Thursday and Friday nights after dinner (Thursdays from 6:00 - 8:30 p.m. and Fridays 6:00 -10:00 p.m.). Special events and activities will occur during these hours, such as basketball tournaments, Chopped cooking competitions, guest speakers or performers, bubble soccer, laser tag, etc. Older teens can participate in the Teen Center during Middle School Nights as well.

Keystone Conference Preview

The National Keystone Conference is Boys & Girls Clubs of America's premier teen conference. The conference provides Keystone service Club members with positive opportunities to engage and socialize with peers, explore teen issues relevant to their lives,

and develop skills to support and enhance service and leadership efforts in Clubs and communities. More than 2,500 Keystone Club members, advisors, speakers and guests will come together for the 51st Annual National Keystone Conference in Denver, Colorado in Spring 2018. Youth of the Year Scholarship Info

Junior and Senior Club members who have been picked as an Overall Youth of the Month during the previous year can compete for the \$10,000 Youth of the Year Higher Education Scholarship. Members fill out an application and complete essays about their personal brand and future goals, as well as participate in an interview process. One winner is selected who will receive the scholarship and also represent the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh as our ambassador at various events and fundraisers and go on to compete for the title of State Youth of the Year.

After School Care Program

In addition to our Club facilities, the Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh provides state of Wisconsin licensed after-school care programs in two local elementary schools: Jacob Shapiro and Lakeside Elementary. These programs provide children with fun and educational activities, snack time, gym games, cooking projects, and many other opportunities starting from school dismissal until 6:00 p.m.

Jacob Shapiro Elementary has 34 spots available and Lakeside Elementary has 48 spots available. Registration is accepted on a first-come, first- served basis.

If you would like to pay by automatic withdrawal, you can receive a 5% discount on the daily after-school care fees by completing a Voided Check/Automatic Withdrawal Form. If you choose to send your child to our after school program fewer than five days a week, we must also receive a schedule of your child's planned attendance two weeks in advance. Any changes to your weekly attendance schedule need to be made by Wednesday of the week prior in order to avoid being charged for days your child will not attend.

More about the Program

- Children may work on homework, create art projects, and play organized indoor and outdoor activities.
- The program operates on early release Wednesdays for enrolled children only.
- Drop-ins are not allowed.

21st Century Community Learning Center (CLC) Programs at School Sites

The Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh collaborates with the Oshkosh Area School District to offer after school programs that provide academic enrichment opportunities focused on literacy and math. This program is funded in cooperation with the Oshkosh Area School District and the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction 21st Century Community Learning Center Grant Program.

The Lighted School House program is offered at: Washington, Roosevelt, and Merrill Elementary Schools.

The MELT (Middle Extended Learning Time) program is offered at: Perry Tipler/ALPS and Merrill Middle Schools.

There are limited spots in each of these programs.

How to Enroll

Enrollment packets will be accepted at school registration. Participants will be notified of enrollment status at each site's open house. Packets must be filled out completely and turned in to the site coordinator.

Program Fees and Payment Information

The yearly program fee is \$125 per year. There is an additional charge of \$10 per month for extended pick up (5:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m.). Middle school program fee is \$40 per semester. Additional payment options and scholarships are available upon request.

Students work with classroom leads and certified teachers on homework assignments and participate in skill-building activities designed to complement their day-school learning. Activities are interactive, project-based, and allow participants to apply their knowledge to real-life experiences.

Mentoring Program

The Great Futures Start Here Mentoring Program is collaboration with the Oshkosh Area School District, YMCA, ADVOCAP, and Junior Achievement. The program matches youth who could benefit from a positive role model with a volunteer from the Oshkosh community.

Mentors and mentees (matches) meet at the Club and/ or at school and participate in fun activities together. This includes working on homework, reading a book, arts & crafts, STEM projects, playing games, working out in our fitness center, baking & cooking, etc. The minimum requirement is to meet 1 hour a week or 4 hours a month.

During the school year, all mentoring youth are strongly encouraged to meet with the Academic

& Career Specialists to keep an eye on the student's grades. Once in high school they also participate in career development programming where they will create resumes, cover letters, learn how to apply for a job, prepare for interviews, etc.

Each youth works with their mentor and mentoring coordinator to develop a plan for their future following high school graduation. The ultimate goal is that each youth will graduate high school and have a plan to be employed, enrolled, or enlisted.
