Reader's Café

The Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh and the Winnebago County Literacy Council have been awarded a three-year grant from the Basic Needs Giving Partnership, supported by the U.S. Venture Fund for Basic Needs within the Oshkosh Area Community Foundation, the J.J. Keller Foundation, and other community partners. This grant enables a new collaboration called Reader's Café, a literacy intervention program for youth, ages 6-18. The goal is to improve learners' reading proficiency, fluency, and confidence, and ultimately enhance their attitude toward reading.

According to the Wisconsin Information System for Education, 70 percent of fourth graders in the Oshkosh Area School District scored "below proficient" on standardized reading assessments in 2015. The Kids Count Data Center notes that children who reach fourth grade unable to read proficiently are more likely to drop out of high school. The Reader's Café program will help children who struggle academically due to low literacy and those who need to catch up to the reading level of their peers.



Reader's Café started this summer for our 6-12 year old members. Members participated in programs called Reader's Theater and Choral Reading, which teach students fluency and comprehension through performance based reading. At the end of the sessions, members performed for their guardians and staff members. One-on-one tutoring and a book club are provided for our teen members so they are able to leave high school with the literacy skills needed for life.

Lowes Renovation Across America

Boys & Girls Club of Oshkosh has been awarded a grant from Boys & Girls Clubs of America and Lowes Renovation Across America program.
